Grad Student Spotlight

COURTNEY PHILLIPS

Courtney Phillips is a Ph.D. student from San Antonio, Texas studying Animal and Dairy Sciences with a focus on Equine Nutrition and Exercise Physiology. Her major professor is Dr. Clay Cavinder. Courtney grew up riding English and showing locally in hunters and jumpers before playing polo in college. She aspired to be a vet but changed her mind during her undergraduate at Texas A&M University. She decided to pursue her Master's at Texas A&M University and upon graduation, became a Nutritional Consultant for Hill's Science Diet. Courtney began her studies at Mississippi State University in the Fall of 2016. She was formerly the assistant coach of the MSU English Equestrian Team and currently is the assistant coach of the Horse Judging Team. She conduced a research project exploring the effect of probiotics on apparent nutrient digestibility and the fecal microbial population in the sedentary horse, as well as blood metabolites in the exercising horse. Currently, Courtney is preparing to begin a project studying the effect of prebiotics on apparent nutrient digestibility, the fecal microbial population, and hormone interactions (insulin and PYY) on normal and insulin resistant horses.



Hello, my name is Marie E. Cozzarelli and I am a junior majoring in Animal and Dairy Sciences with a concentration in Veterinary Science and a minor International Studies in Agriculture. Currently, I am a part of the Undergraduate Research Scholars Program at Mississippi State University and have been working under the supervision of Dr. Jean M. Feugang in the department of Animal and Dairy Sciences. This past November I had the opportunity to travel with other MSU undergraduate students to Atmore, Alabama to attend the 2017 NanobioSummit meeting to present my poster entitled "Comparative analysis of cadmium and cadmium-free quantum dot interactions with boar spermatozoa".
